# Fluid Requirements

- Offer plenty of fresh water once the animal is passing fluids.
- If the patient is not drinking then oral fluids (40L) via a stirrup pump can be administered.
- Dehydration and electrolytes imbalances should be corrected rapidly with IV fluids.

# General Care

- Diet should be low fibre and low starch.
- High grain diets should be avoided until adhesion formation.
- Any concurrent conditions can be treated like ketosis.

# Post Operative Healing

Provided that:

1. The patient is not suffering from any concurrent diseases
2. Operational sterility was observed
3. Postoperative cleanliness is good

The incision healing should be uncomplicated.

# Prognosis

Prognosis after this surgery is generally very good.

Short term success rates of 98.5% have been published.
