**Course Description:** An examination of the concept of caring and the philosophy of self-care as an essential component of caring for others will be the focus of the course. Exploration of one's ability for self-care and participation in self-care activities will illuminate the meaning of caring for self to nursing practice. Theory and research related to caring will be explored.

## **Learning goals:**

- 1. Explore the meaning of self-care to caring nursing practice through development and implementation of a self-care plan.
- 2. Explore selected caring theoretical models and the relationship to caring as the essence of nursing practice, education and leadership. (1)

- 3. Explore the concept of caring as it relates to the role of the advanced practice nurse in leadership and education roles. (9)
- 4. Examine the concept of caring as it relates to providing holistic care in a culturally diverse environment. (3,10)
- 5. Demonstrate the ability to communicate within a caring philosophy to improve nursing education, the quality of professional nursing practice and the health care system (7).

#### **Course Content:**

- 1. The relationship between self-care and quality caring
- 2. Caring as the essence of quality nursing practice.
- 3. Theoretical and evidence based frameworks for caring
- 4. Quality caring and cultural competence
- 5. Ethical decision making and caring.
- 6. Caring in the context of nursing education and nursing management

#### **Caring Groups**

This course focuses on the opportunity for students to gain an understanding of the importance of caring for self and others for quality nursing practice.

Individual learning activities within the course provide the opportunity to learn caring for self.

Through Caring Groups, students will engage in activities designed to promote caring for colleagues.

Students will be given the opportunity to sign up for caring groups. These groups will be designed to function as work groups during face to face and online in-class experiences. Students will also be encouraged to engage electronically with their Caring Group members to provide support to each other throughout the course.
