Advantages & Disadvantages of Equine Castration

Advantages:

- 1. Eliminate or reduce aggressive behaviour due to no testosterone being produced by the testicles.
- 2. Easier and calmer for handling purposes.
- 3. Eliminate sexual activity and unwanted matings, which can affect the athletic performance of the horse. In horse racing, it may be beneficial as an uncastrated horse may get distracted.
- 4. Eliminate the risk of developing testicular tumors and testicular trauma.
- 5. Prevent unwanted genetic traits from passing to offspring. i.e. a cryptorchid.

Disadvantages

- 1. Cheaper castration methods exist which the farmer may attempt to do himself. These methods increase the risk of infection.
- 2. It is a traumatic experience for the horse.
- 3. There is potentially a decrease in weight gain post surgery for a period of time in younger horses.
